

St. Philip's Mission Statement:

We are happy to have you visiting St. Philip's today. If you are a guest or visitor, *(in person)* we hope you will take a moment to receive a welcome package and fill out the Guest Information Form inside. After filling out the form please place it in the collection plate or hand it to one of the greeters at the end of the service. *(Guest online)* We ask that you email us with your information, and we will mail you a welcome package.

The order of the service is given in the leaflet. If the hymns are not printed, they can be found in the Hymnal, (H1982) which is the larger, blue book or in the Lift Every Voice and Sing II, (LEVAS) which is the multi-color book.

The Great Hall is through the front doors on the right of the sanctuary, down the steps, through the doors, where fellowship is held immediately following the 10:30 AM service.

The restrooms are also through the same sanctuary door, down the steps, turn left, go straight down to the end of the hallway, and turn right. You will see the restrooms on the left.

Holy Communion is the sacred meal of the Christian faith. The Episcopal Church, as all churches rooted in the historic Christian faith, affirms that the sacrament of Baptism is the ancient and normative entry point for receiving the sacrament of Eucharist; we also believe that anyone who desires to receive the Body and Blood of our Lord is always welcome at God's table. To receive the Bread, extend your open hands to the priest. To receive the Wine, you may sip from the chalice by gently guiding it by its base to your lips; or you may leave the Bread on your palm for a Eucharistic Minister to dip the bread in the cup and place on your tongue [intinction]; or you may receive the Wine in an individual cup.

If there is anything that you would like to know about St. Philip's or would like to become a member, please ask the Rector, one of the ushers, or one of the greeters. We hope that you enjoy your visit today and look forward to seeing you again.

The Gathering of God's People

First Candle - The Candle of Hope

Reader Today is the first Sunday of Advent.
Advent is a time of waiting. We wait for God to send divine love and light into our dark world.

Reader How does this happen?

Reader God's light comes through Jesus, who became a human being just like you and me, so that he could show us the way back to God's divine love and light.

All *Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and put on the armor of light.*

Reader **A Reading from the prophet Isaiah:** *Isaiah 2:3-4*
Many people will come and say, "Let's go to the mountain of the Lord God of Jacob and worship in his temple." The Lord will teach us his Law from Jerusalem, and we will obey him. He will settle arguments between nations. They will pound their swords and their spears into rakes and shovels; they will never make war or attack one another.

Reader Today, we wait for God to send Jesus to us. We wait for a time of safety, a time of justice, a time of peace. We begin in the dark, and on this first Sunday of Advent, we light the first candle.

First candle is lit. While this is being done, the following is read:

Reader Every week in Advent, we will light another candle. Each candle that we light will remind us that the Light of the World will soon come to us in the human form of the baby Jesus.

All *The Kingdom of God is drawing near. May we prepare our hearts for God's light to bring peace to Jerusalem and to every city and country in our world. Amen.*







What is a Vestry?

In the Anglican tradition, the “Vestry” is what other churches might call a “church board.” It’s the leadership body responsible for the parish. “Vestry” originally referred to the room in the church “*in which the vestments, vessels, and other requisites for Divine worship are kept and in which the clergy robe.*” However, since the Vestry was the room in which church business meetings took place, the word also came to mean “*an elective body...composed of the rector and a group of elected parishioners administering the temporal affairs of the parish*” (*Merriam-Webster’s Collegiate Dictionary*).

St. Philip’s Vestry leads the parish in partnership with the clergy. The Vestry governs in three primary capacities: fiduciary (budgets and buildings), strategic (long-range planning), and generative (providing wisdom, guidance, and creative ideas for mission and ministries). Vestry members, who represent the congregation in every area of decision-making, are elected at the annual parish meeting held in late January and serve staggered three-year terms. The group meets monthly to discuss new business and vote on the business of the parish. (*We will have a vestry retreat in late February/March 2023*) If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Pam Arey, at pkarey@aol.com

Vestry Qualification

Adult communicant members of St. Philip's in good standing who are also confirmed may run for Vestry.

- ✚ Member = Baptism recorded in the parish register
- ✚ Adult = Sixteen years of age or over
- ✚ Confirmed = Confirmation, Reception, or Baptism as an adult, by a Bishop of the Episcopal Church, recorded in the parish register
- ✚ Communicant = Received Holy Communion at least three times during the previous year
- ✚ In good standing = for the previous year have been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and have been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God; this latter is understood to mean, at a minimum, a regular and recorded financial contributor to the parish.
